Notes

100m

The official report says "There was a hard struggle between Meyer and Jacobs, but the American was the strongest in the last 10 metres". So Jacobs may well have been 2nd, as per Mallon and Buchanan, although zur Megede also has him as 3s3.

Applegarth is now given as 2s5 by Mallon and Magnusson, with Vygoda (BOH) now 3s5.

400m

Only Ernest Henley in semi-final 3 is consistently listed as a dnf. The official report says that the last 3 in semi-final 2 did not finish, which would include Seedhouse and Wells, but the report omits to list Wells and Person of Germany.

1920 The official report has incomplete details and only winning times, but Mallon has found results including distances between all places from another source, so we now have estimated times for all of the competitors in the quarter finals.

800m

- 1908 Ian Buchanan clarified the inclusion of Manogue in his Internationals book: "Although listed as an entrant in the 1908 Official Report there was, until recently, no evidence that he actually competed in the Olympics. However, a report in the South London Harriers Gazette states that he started in Heat Four of the 800, but dropped out around the halfway mark."
- Burton: Buchanan says "he finished last in his heat in Stockholm". zur Megede says 5h4, as does Buchanan, but Magnusson says "5h4 dnf?".
 Hulford: Mallon also has dnf s2, but zur Megede has 7s1 and Buchanan has 7s2 (typo). Magnusson has "7s1 dnf?".

1500m

1908 E.V. Loney was Ernest Vincent Loney b. 3 Jul 1882, so Vincent rather than Victor as in some sources.

5000m

Ruffell is given as 6h2 in Buchanan and zur Megede. The official report states: "One lap and a half from the finish Fitzgerald and Ruffel had had enough and retired". It also indicates that Lee and Treble did not finish, although there may be other evidence that justifies their 4th places that are widely quoted and accepted by all modern publications.

10000m

- 1912 Official report says: dnf h1 Lee and Ruffell; dnf h2 Humphreys and Hibbins; dnf h3 Wallach Most sources give these as dnf. zur Megede gives placings for all starters, perhaps indicating the order in which they dropped out, and Buchanan and Phillips both follow these placings. As Bob Phillips writes on the American Kramer, "according to the New York Times he did not finish 10th as reported, but retired in the 18th lap". So perhaps the same applied to the British runners. That would mean a clean sweep of dnfs/dns for the United Kingdom.
- 1936 Jack Potts may have finished the race see Track Stats Vol 51 No 3. Film evidence seems to show him being lapped very late in the race.
- Mike Sheridan lists McCooke as 12th in 31:23.0 in his 2010 book "Who's Who of British International Athletes 1945-1960". He believes the source was probably Robert Hanna's book "The Armoy Athletes" about Steve and Charlie McCooke. It seems hard to believe that no one else recorded the place and time of a British athlete at a home Olympics.

Marathon

1908 A. Wyatt is sometimes given as Albert, but Buchanan gives Alfred Wyatt from Radcliffe Harriers and an Alfred Wyatt of Bolton United placed 13th in the National Cross Country in 1910.

3000m Steeplechase

Thomas Cushing is in the official results as 8h2, but Buchanan says "He went to Paris in 1924 as a reserve on the Olympic team but did not compete". He is not listed in Mallon or Magnusson.

High Jump

1912 Ian Buchanan explains: "Due to an error in the 1912 Official Report, Tom O'Donahue's name is not listed. Recent research has revealed that he did, in fact, take part in the high jump at Stockholm, but failed to clear the opening height".

Hammer

2012 Alex Smith may be upgraded to 11th (and 10q) if the disqualification of Kirill Ikonnikov is confirmed.

All-Around (before the Decathlon)

The "All-Around" contest in which Kiely and Holloway competed was in fact the AAU Championships, on 4th July, whereas the Olympic athletics ran from 29 August to 3 September. This "All-Around" was never considered part of the Olympics by anyone until 1954 when an Irish journalist convinced the IOC to co-opt the event into their history books.

4x100m Relay

Originally the GBR team was listed as Hill, Abrahams, D'Arcy, Edward. However, as Ian Buchanan explains, "Denis Black was brought onto the 1920 Olympic 4x100m relay team after Harry Edward sustained an injury in the 200m final." This was for both rounds. The original entry would have said Edwards, so this must have been fed into the official results.

4x400m Relay

1924 Team order in the official results is Lindsay, Butler, Ainsworth-Davis, Griffiths, but this is simply a mistake. Butler definitely ran the anchor leg.

Women

100m

2012 Abi Oyepitan upgraded from 8s1 after the later disqualification of Semoy Hackett (TRI).

200m

2012 Anyika Onuora upgraded from 4h2 after the later disqualification of Semoy Hackett (TRI).

Discus

2004 Roles and Newman upgraded after the later disgualification of Irina Yatchenko (BLR).

4x400m Relay

The IAAF has decided not to disqualify the USA team despite the the doping disqualification of Crystal Cox of the USA, because she only ran in the heat of the relay. Thus GBR remains 4th.

1948

Adjusted times can be given for some events, and in some cases these were mixed in with the official results or with unofficial results in our compilation. The corrected times are given in brackets below, with the original official results unparenthesised. For performances not listed here, no adjusted times are available.

Vallé was originally officially listed as 6th, then later given as 4th in some publications. The confirmation of 6th place comes from photo-finish evidence.

1948 4q1 Leslie Lewis 49.2 (-) 1h7 48.9 (49.0)

800 METRES

Parlett was officially not given a placing or a time in the final. Unofficial contemporary sources gave his position as 9th in a time of 1:54.0, with the Dane Niels Holst-Sørensen 8th in 1:53.4. However, review of the photo-finish film by Bob Sparks revealed that Parlett was in fact 8th with a time of 1:56.3, with Holst-Sørensen very close behind in 1:56.4.

Harold Tarraway is sometimes given as 8th in his semi-final, but he was a schoolmaster of Trevor Clowes and said he regretted not finishing that race.
