Congratulations to Dr. Carol Endersby who married Dr. David Cowan on Friday 1st May ..... Richard Hymans and Ian Hodge recently had their compilation "Best Non-Winning Performances by Place" published in Track Newsletter..... Brian Rowan has produced 'A Statistical History of N.I. Track and Field Athletics', available from him at 29 Wood End, Holywood, Co. Down, N.Ireland, at 50p plus postage. He points out that this is very much a pioneering venture, but it will he hopes be a step in the right direction towards bringing Ulster statistics into line with the rest of the U.K. In the 18-page A4 document he includes N.I. all-time top 10s at each men's event, together with comments on notable athletes and their major accomplishments, such as a detailed look at 'Ulster's Top Milers' and 'The History of Ulster Marathon Running'. He also includes N.I. Top 20s for the 1980 season and a list of N.I. records.

The youngest is still Jim Ryun at 17yrs 37 days but Steve Cram (17 yrs 261 days) and Graham Williamson are now 2nd and 3rd youngest 4 minute milers - oldest is George Young (34 yrs 220 days) and again UK fills 2nd and 3rd positions! Adrian Weatherhead (33 yrs 339 days) and Walter Wilkinson (32 yrs 314 days).- Walter Wilkinson's first and last sub-4s spanned 12 yrs 52days - Denmark's Gunnar Nielsen (250328) is the oldest living. ## TWINS IN ATHLETICS

It is exactly ten years ago since I last touched on this subject in NUTS Notes (Vol.9, No.1). To recapitulate for newer readers: despite their known limitations, twin studies do enable assessments to be made of the relative importance of heredity and environment - and of the interaction between the two - on various traits.

A common procedure is to compare samples of monozygotic (MZ) twins, possessing identical genes; of like-sex dizygotic (DZ) twins, possessing no more genes in common than siblings of different ages would be expected to possess; and of like-sex single born subjects.

The aim of the present study is to locate as many twins as possible where both members of a pair have participated in athletics. In order to calculate intra-pair differences, the twins' best marks at all events were scored on the 1977 IAAF Tables (Men), 1975 IAAF Tables (Women) and 1966 Swedish Walking Association Tables (Men & Women), the intra-pair difference being that between each twin's highest scoring performance. It is hoped to obtain definite evidence of zygosity so that a comparison can be made of inter-pair differences (i.e. between the MZ and DZ groups).

It may be of interest to mention the possibility of using co-twin control studies to compare two different forms of teaching or training content. Only identical (MZ) twins would be the subjects of such studies, since any intra-pair differences at the start of the experiment would probably be negligible and could reasonably be assumed to stem from non-genetic factors. Such studies could be confined to quite small numbers of twin pairs; the difficulty lies in securing the co-operation of the twins in such studies - for obvious reasons!

## WORLD STUDENT GAMES

I am putting the finishing touches to "The Guinness Book of Athletics Facts & Feats", which I hope will be published by Guinness Superlatives in the Spring/Summer of 1982. The contents of the book will follow the style of the twenty-plus titles in the Guinness Facts & Feats series - at least 256 pages, with plenty of illustrations including 16 pages of colour.

The scope will be wide-ranging, presenting the superlatives of the sport in, I hope, an interesting way. Backing up the facts I aim to introduce some fascinating and amusing anecdotes, and would welcome any suggestions from NUTS members. I would also greatly appreciate any good photographs which members may have to illustrate the subjects covered, whether of record-breakers or of interesting people/things.

I will be surveying the origins of athletics and holders of various superlatives from each country, records, major championships, athletes successful at other walks of life, etc..

As a 'taster' of the book, here is my first draft for The World Student Games.

The 'Universiade' or World Student Games has become established as one of the most important international fixtures. They are run by the Federation Internationale du Sport Universitaire (FISU) and are entered by athletes either in or who have just completed full-time further education.

The first 'International Universities' Games' was held in Warsaw in 1924 in conjunction with the annual congress of the CIE (Confederation Internationale des Etudiants). The meeting was organised at short notice and Poland had the most successful athletics team. There was no British team but Dr. Arthur Porritt, of Oxford University and New Zealand, was an English delegate to the congress and was persuaded to compete; he won the 100m in 10.9 and the 200m in 22.2 and was 2nd in the 110m in 15.8

The first English representation came in 1928 in Paris with an athletics team of 32 placing 5th. At Darmstadt in 1930 women's events were staged for the first time, though British women first competed in Turin in 1933.

From 1947 to 1962 FISU (U) and UIE (S) held separate Games, the standard being much stronger at the Communist inspired UIE Games, known as the World Youth Games from 1954. Since the merging of the Games from 1963 the standards have risen to their present status.

The most individual victories at one event was achieved by Iolanda Balas (Rom) with the well-nigh incredible total of eight high jump victories. With Games now held biennially and stricter rules on participation no one will be able to go close to her record. She was aided of course by the rival Games and won the UIE organised events of 1954, 1955, 1957, 1959 and 1962 and the FISU Games of 1957, 1959 and 1961. Aleksandra Chudina (USSR) won a total of ten individual victories: 1949 - HJ; 1951 - 80mH, HJ, LJ, Pen; 1953 - HJ, LJ, JT, Pen; 1955 - JT. Four individual victories in one year, which Chudina achieved twice is also a record, though Trebisonda Valla (Ita) 1933 and Gisela Mauermayer (Ger) 1937 each won three individual events and shared in a relay victory. Most men's victories is five by Janusz Sidlo (Pol), JT - 1951, 1954, 1955, 1957 and 1959 and Igor Ter-Ovanesyan (USSR), LJ - 1959S, 1961U, 1962S, 1963, 1965. Since 1963 the only athlete to win the same event on three occasions is Pietro Mennea (Ita), of one included the unofficial International Students meeting of 1975. He won the 200m in 1973, 1975 and 1979.

## THE STEEPLECHASE - A SECOND-RATE EVENT AND/OR AN EVENT FOR SECOND-RATERS?

It is my contention that in the U.K. the Steeple-chase recruits those who are unable, or feel unable, to find success in a flat event. I would submit that it is not unreasonable to assume that an athlete achieving a ranking in the final fifty of the Steeplechase should be of sufficient standard to at least achieve a ranking of similar level in the five kilometres. Yet what do we find? In 1979 of the ten athletes ranked between 40th and 50th only one ranks in the top 100 of the five kilometres and he in the 80s!! It will doubtless be argued that the steeplechase calls for athletes of a particular talent or skill. And no doubt that courage plays some part as well. The hurdling "techniques" of most chasers is akin to that reflected in pictures of hurdling 100 years ago. Even in the higher echelons one observes clumsy hurdle clearances.

On the other side of the coin it is true that a number of class "flat" runners have tried the steeplechase and failed - by their standards anyway - but the scene, in my view, is set by the well remembered sight of Dave Bedford, as a virtual novice, running at the Palace and clocking 8:28.6 in 1971. A time only ever beaten by a sprinkling of British athletes - all "specialists" - since. My ideal steeplechaser who performed at the very highest level over the barriers was Maurice Herriott. He was only an average cross-country runner, and on the flat he only ever achieved modest times. As a tylist he probably ranks first and his times would even now ensure a regular G.B. team place.

Certainly the event in this country has stood still for a decade. Excepting perhaps John Davies's run in Christchurch and Dennis Coates's Montreal effort forward placings in good times at major championships are still to be achieved. It is true that much the same story is to be seen elsewhere in the world and I suggest this reflects a general situation where athletes have accepted that they are more likely to succeed in this i.e. weaker, event.

#### SIEGFRIED HERRMANN - MY KIND OF ATHLETE

Siegfried Herrmann was one of the few athletes to be awarded a coveted Croxley Striders vest. Such vests were awarded at the discretion of the membership to exceptional runners and he was certainly that.

His career covered a period between fourteen and twenty-four years ago when standards were quite obviously lower than they are today. His list of best performances would have set him apart from his contemporaries then and would probably do so today. The total range from 800 metres to 10 kilometres is quite exceptional and an inspection of times achieved is indeed mouth-watering in its quality, viz:

Herrmann's record in major championships is a prime weakness in the career review. It would be interesting to hear a view from East Germany (or Len Gebbett) as to why this was. Could it have been injury; if that was the case he showed a tenacious ability to continuously come back over a very long period.

One outstanding feature was his ability to set National records as the following list shows:-

800 - three times  
 1000 - twice  
 1500 - twelve times!!  
 2000 - once  
 3000 - five times.

This has been a superficial, and perhaps error laden, look at the career of an outstanding and relatively unknown runner whose appearances in this country were few although I recall a gun to tape effort at the White City which was most impressive although I cannot remember the distance or whom he beat. Perhaps I can inspire some more qualified NUT to expand on the subject?
