THINKPIECE by Pete Pozzoli

It is my opinion the 100mH and 200mH are pretty much one and the same event, just as I consider the 100m and 200m flat about the same thing. With very rare exceptions, the athletes (of either sex), who make the top rankings in one also do so in the other. The number of sprint doubles in major Games almost outnumber the solo wins.

The big mistake was made in the 1930s when the 60m was dropped from the international schedule. I believe it would have made better sense to have dropped the 100m and retained 60m and 200m as the short distances. Check the lists and you will find the reverse is true - with rare exceptions the top athletes are completely different. Logical enough, since the events call for quite different abilities. The 60m shows us the cheetahs of sprinting; the 100m and 200m both show us the greyhounds.

I would like to see the present 100mH reduced to 90mH with 3m to the first hurdle and a 3.5m run-in (number of hurdles and distance between to remain unchanged). This would throw the emphasis entirely on hurdling ability alone, and rule out sprinting ability. (How often have you seen the first girl over the last hurdle beaten at the run-in? Which - as I see it - means the best hurdler lost!)

Men reckon the 400mH is the killer of the track. I do not suggest women should run it. But... if women from 13 to 40 have run Marathons without dying I feel sure they could run a 300mH event without harm. This event would be a boon for the host of women able to run 400m in under 60% but just not fast enough to be top class. These girls have the stamina for a fast hurdles event of 300m, which would be the counterpart of the men's 400mH.

almost identical in names, I would wager after my suggested 90mH (over 2-9) and 300mH (over 2-6) events had shaken down, it would be as rare to see the same athletes at the top of both lists as it is now in the men's 110mH and 400mH.

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TWINS IN ATHLETICS by Andrew Huxtable

Since the article by Cliff Temple appeared in the June 1967 issue of "World Sports", I have been attempting to carry out some more detailed research on twins in athletics.

Despite their known limitations, twin studies do enable assessments to be made of the relative importance of heredity and environment - and of the interaction between the two - on various traits:

A common procedure is to compare samples of monozygotic (MZ) twins, possessing identical genes, of like-sex dizygotic (DZ) twins, possessing no more genes in common than siblings of different ages would be expected to possess, and of like-sex singletwins.

The aim of the present study is to locate as many twins as possible where both members of a pair have participated in athletics. In order to calculate intra-pair differences, the twins' best marks at all events are scored on the 1962 Portuguese Tables, the intra-pair difference being that between the highest scoring performances of co-twins. It is hoped to obtain definite evidence of zygosity (based mainly on comparisons of blood groups and germinal configurations) so that a comparison can be made of mean inter-pair differences, i.e. between the MZ and DZ groups. Incidentally, only one unlike-sex (DZ) pair has been noted so far.
