unratified as the bar was held in place by the officials. Was an exhibition mark anyway.

1.965u George Rowdon 15.4.1864 1 exhib Haytor Army Camp 6 Aug 1890

unratified as it was an exhibition mark (but under AAA rules)

1.968u George Rowdon 15.4.1864 1 exhib Chudleigh 19 Aug 1890

unratified as it was an exhibition mark (conditions unknown)

The decade list for 1881-1890 (page 25) for Rowdon should therefore read (NB metric/imperial conversions):
